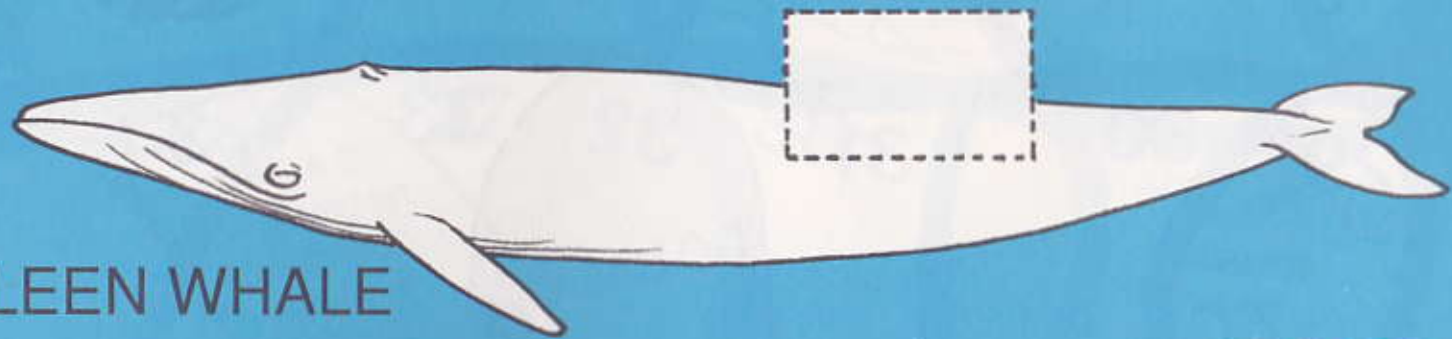
Answer: Female - the dorsal fin of the adult male is bigger and a different shape



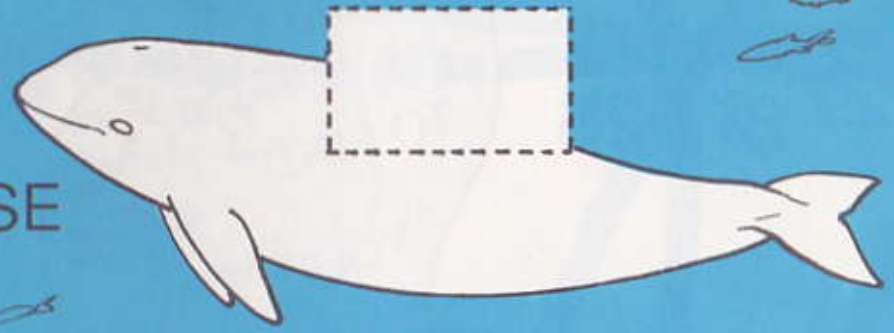

The fin which most whales and dolphins have on their back is called a dorsal fin. Dorsal fins are different shapes and sizes. *Can you match these?*

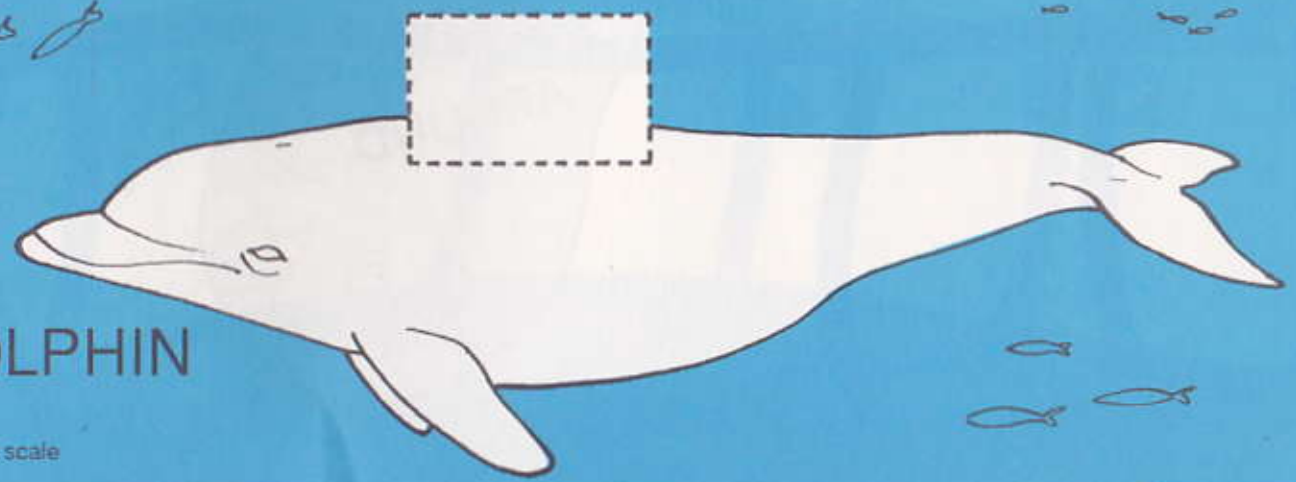
